TURN OVER to explore The Captain Cook Birthplace Museum

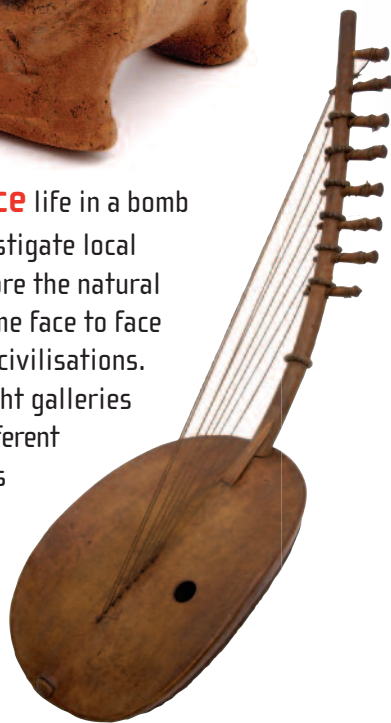
**Amazing** objects from Middlesbrough's historic priory to the jungles of South America.
