November 2008 marks the 90th anniversary of the end of World War 1. This exhibition commemorates some of the local people who fought in what at the time was called 'the war to end all wars'.

The exhibition will feature personal objects, militaria and family stories to give an insight into what it meant to fight or to be a family effected by the war. All three services - navy, army and flying corps will be represented as well as the merchant navy.

Also on display will be work by students from Macmillan Academy in Middlesbrough who are amassing photographs, stories, letters and videos relating to their visits to the WWI battlefields in France and Belgium.
